INSTRUCTIONS TO INTERVIEWER: The interview should serve several purposes. First and most important, we are asking you to make an assessment as to whether this would be a good family to host an ATAD International Student. Second, we are hoping to gain the information necessary to make a successful placement, if this family is accepted. As you talk with the family, think about what kind of student will be comfortable with them, and vice versa. Do they need a quiet, sheltered student? One who lives and breathes sports? One who needs an intellectual environment? Last, and very important, during the interview a family can begin to think about what it will mean to have a student live with them. Many of the questions will help facilitate this process, and enable the family to think of questions they may wish to ask you. Please evaluate the family as fully and thoughtfully as you can. If a family member is away from the home (e.g. at summer camp or on a trip) at the time of the interview, the interviewer can contact him or her at a later time, and document that contact.
